



Its scale and sophistication of design make it one of the truly elegant plantation houses in North Carolina. **Free for all conference attendees.**

A Word on Princeville

Nearby Historic Princeville was originally established by Black citizens in 1865 as the Freedom Hill community. The village was renamed Princeville in honor of freedman Turner Prince when it was incorporated in 1885. During the Reconstruction Era, Black citizens sought to build their own churches, schools, and political institutions across the Tar River from Tarboro. The relatively inexpensive land on which Princeville was built was sold to Black purchasers because it was subject to flooding and therefore unsuitable for development. The area has been destroyed by flooding nine times since 1800, and therefore has little surviving fabric to show for its deep history. This inequity of land ownership within a vulnerable space has contributed to North Carolina's Environmental Justice movement. Today, the NC Environmental Justice Network monitors injustices based on race, ethnicity, and income.

Proceeds from this event will support Preservation North Carolina.


